



Elisabeth was a young mother at the time, but she journeyed and lived among the Waoroni tribe for years...and shared the love of God with them. They accepted the beautiful story of Jesus and His love for them.

The story is memorialized in the movie End of the Spear.

Elisabeth passed away in 2015 after a life of service to others.

The lesson series that became the book Suffering is Never for Nothing, is her beautiful reflection of what God had done in her life and how she had traveled through heartache and loss.
