The reason my son was using a rake was not because it was the best way to complete the task. It wasn't about the task; it was about who I want him to be, not just what I wanted him to do. I wanted him to work with me, not apart from me. I wanted him to learn and develop his ability to work outside, and even work through something that is "boring." No screens, no music in our ears, just a task that needs to be completed. He will face many similar tasks like that in life. He will get stronger. I'm excited to see all the ways God is using our church and shaping us in the process.




